We are starting with a traditional flag ceremony and get acquainted game.

Session One, 9:45-10:45 am, select one:

	Cooking in Cans (Part 1 of two parts, must take both) - As Girl Scouts- we always use resources wisely! Come join us to see what we can cook and make in cans! We will build a Vagabond Stove with Buddy Burners and try them out. We will also cover some ways to do meal planning and prep with your troop, and even play some "while you wait for food to cook" games. [maximum 15 persons] Led by Donna Tornich and Friends

	Back Pocket Activities - You planned your troop meeting, expecting to have the girls work on the project for the entire time but they finish everything so fast.
